



Youth Talk Volunteer Roles

Community Champion

Time commitment: 3 to 5 hours a week

Reporting to: Volunteer Lead and Fundraising Manager

Location: St Albans District

Community Champions help raise awareness and funds for Youth Talk across their own networks and local community. They act as positive ambassadors, introducing people to our work, encouraging others to get involved and finding opportunities for support. Champions choose how they contribute, whether that is hosting or organising small fundraising events and challenges, making local connections or helping us reach new audiences. This role suits someone confident speaking to others and passionate about supporting young people's mental health.

Event Helper

Time commitment: Ad hoc. Most events last 4 to 6 hours, with options for shorter 2 to 3 hour shifts

Reporting to: Volunteer Lead

Location: St Albans District

Event Helpers support Youth Talk at community events, school fairs, business breakfasts, sports fixtures and local festivals. Tasks vary by event but often include helping with set up, greeting visitors, sharing leaflets or merchandise, supporting simple fundraising activities and speaking to the public about who we are when approached. This role is flexible and ideal for people who want to volunteer occasionally. Full briefings and support are always provided.

Ad Hoc Volunteer

Time commitment: Flexible, often around 2 hours per month

Reporting to: Volunteer Lead

Location: St Albans District

Ad Hoc Volunteers help with small, practical tasks that arise throughout the year. These might include posting flyers, moving equipment between local venues, helping with simple office or admin tasks or supporting light logistical jobs. Requests are shared through a WhatsApp group and volunteers can opt in when they have time. This role suits people who want to contribute in a low-commitment, highly flexible way.

Specialist Skills Volunteer

Time commitment: 4 to 5 hours a week or 1 to 2 days a month, but flexible depending on the skill and project

Reporting to: Volunteer Lead

Location: St Albans District ideally, but remote depending on task

Specialist Skills Volunteers offer professional expertise that supports Youth Talk's small team. This is ideal for people who want to use their specialist skills to help young people but cannot commit to regular volunteering. Skills we especially welcome include graphic design, will writing, AI automation and Google Analytics reporting. Capacity for new projects varies, but we encourage professionals to get in touch as opportunities arise throughout the year.
